Registration: Registration forms are on page 23. Registration is based on a first come-first served, PAID basis or certificate of eligibility. Online registrations are accepted at <u>www.rsu25.maineadulted.org</u> using a credit or debit card. You can also fill out our registration form and drop it off at our office, fax to 469-2192, or mail the form. Check, cash, money order, credit or debit cards are accepted, but please do not mail cash. Pre-registration is required unless otherwise indicated to allow instructors to prepare materials and prevent course cancellations or overbooking.

When registering, please notify staff regarding any information we may need while you are enrolled with us (i.e. allergies, accommodations, etc.). Individuals with a disability who may need accommodations are requested to contact Kathy Pelletier, Director, at least two weeks in advance of the event, so that appropriate accommodations/arrangements may be made.

Registration Confirmations: No confirmation will be sent unless there are course changes or if you have not enrolled early enough to meet the course enrollment minimum. When pre-registering by phone, you will be put on our waiting list until payment has been received. *In order to secure a seat in the class, payment, certificate of eligibility or training approval MUST be made at time of registration.*

Refunds: If we cancel a class, all fees will be refunded. Unless a class has been filled, has only the minimum number necessary, or indicates otherwise, if you withdraw before the second class, all course fees will be refunded. There are no refunds for missed one-night workshops.





Computer and Technology

CAD I

Healthcare

Behavioral Health Professional Certification Training

Our community is looking for individuals who want to make a difference in a child's life.

Children's Behavioral Health Services are vital to Maine's children with Intellectual Disabilities, Autism and Mental Health Disorders and their families. The need in our area is great!

As an integral part of the child's treatment team, a Certified Behavioral Health Professional (BHP) has the opporunity to make an immediate impact while helping a child frow and develop to their full potential.

We are excited to connect our community to this wonderful ONLINE training program. The online training will equip you to help children who are reciving Behavioral Health services. The training will prepare you for employment through local social services providers. The training can be started at any time and finished at your own pace.

You will complete 12 online modules and 12 hours of live instruction (offered virtually). An online Bloodborne Pathogens training, as well as Child & Adult First Aid & CPR training, will be made available to you, if you do not already possess those certifications. The entire training takes about 45 hours to complete.

Any individual who will be 18 years of age or older upon completion of the course, may register. (Individuals must be at least 18 and have a high school diploma or equivalent to get certified.)

Behavioral Health Professional

If you're great with kids and want to make a significant difference in the lives of children and families, consider this BHP training and certification. It is required for direct care providers working in Children's Behavioral Health Services, either in the school or home/community setting. Additional requirements for BHP certification include current Child & Adult CPR/First Aid certification and completion of an OSHA compliant Bloodborne Pathogens training.

To be eligible to take the BHP course, individuals must be at least 18 years old upon completion of course. Additional education requirements must be met to be eligible to provide MaineCare Section 65 services.

CCMA (Certified Clinical Medical Assistant)

Do you want to prepare for an exciting, challenging and rewarding career in healthcare? We train students to assist physicians by performing functions related to the clinical responsibilities of a medical office. Instruction includes preparing patients for examination and treatment, routine laboratory procedures, diagnostic testing, technical aspects of phlebotomy and the cardiac life cycle. Students will review important topics including phlebotomy, pharmacology, the proper use and administration of medications, taking and documenting vital signs, cardiology including proper lead placements, professional workplace behavior, ethics and the legal aspects of healthcare. This program is offered as part of our Adult Education Workforce grants. Enrollment is on an application process. Accepted students will work with Adult Education and partner programs to provide course free of charge. Classes will be hybrid (onsite and online) with onsite labs at multiple locations. 
